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())ecome!

Welcome to the *Crossroads* B'nei Mitzvah Program! This program is designed to come alongside parents and Messianic faith communities as they help their youth transition from childhood to young adulthood. It is designed to culminate in a Bar or Bat Mitzvah ceremony on the Shabbat following your child's 13th birthday, or whatever point after that you see fit.

The term "bar/bat mitzvah" simply means "son/daughter of the commandment" and more than a ceremony, it means that the individual having the ceremony has chosen to take on the responsibility of the commandments of God. The student who desires to become a Bar/Bat Mitzvah is choosing to publicly declare his faith in God and submission to His Word for the rest of his life. In keeping with Jewish heritage, we view this coming-of-age as a change of status for the student – no longer will he or she be viewed as a child, but as a young adult.

In the *Crossroads* program, the act of preparing for and becoming a Bar/Bat Mitzvah means:

- Affirming a desire to live a life of faith in and surrender to the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and discipleship to our Master, Yeshua the Messiah, regardless of whether you were raised Jewish or Gentile
- Taking responsibility for one's own spiritual health and growth
- Entering into a settled sense of identity as a young man or woman of God with a clear sense of purpose in godly living
- Celebrating that choice and achievement surrounded by community

Our program is intended to be a type of "threefold cord [which] is not easily broken" (Ecclesiastes 4:12) and has 3 main components:

- 1. Class and curriculum in your faith community with peers and teacher
- 2. Follow-up conversations and direction at home with parents
- 3. Mentorship with another godly adult in your community (see p. v)

In the Jewish community, children spend a year preparing for their Bar/Bat Mitzvah. This program will take 18 weeks, and we strongly suggest children spend at least 6 months in purposeful learning and growth before their Bar/Bat Mitzvah.

We are excited that your students are taking this step in their relationship with God!

This teacher's guide will walk you through each step of this program. I have tried to be as thorough as I can be with it. It contains answers to all of the Scripture fill-ins and other ideas to help aid your teaching. If you have any feedback about the teacher's guide, I would love to hear it. 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Frogram Overview

Crossroads integrates many different aspects of spiritual education, including:

Lessons about God, Identity, and Godly Living: The core of the *Crossroads* B'nei Mitzvah program will be a series of 18 lessons about God, our identity as believers in Messiah, and various aspects of godly living.

Topics for Home and Mentorship Discussion: We will also include various topics for parents and mentors to discuss with students. These kinds of deep conversations are powerful in helping youth form their convictions.

Scripture Memory: Each lesson includes required Scripture passages for memory that parents or teachers will need to sign off on. Verses are provided in the Tree of Life version, but you can adjust that for your student if desired.

Public Immersion: Scripture shows us the importance of being publicly immersed (baptized) as a sign of our identification with Messiah Yeshua. This is strongly recommended to go along with the program. It is our belief that if a young person isn't ready to be immersed, they are not ready to become a Bar/Bat Mitzvah.

Scripture Reading: Included is a Scripture reading chart. Students are expected to read through the Torah and the Gospels in the 6-12 months leading up to their Bar/Bat Mitzvah.

A Mitzvah Project: As in most Jewish communities, part of this program is the completion of some kind of major project that helps others and shines the light of Messiah to your community.

Preparing to Read from the Torah and Give the Drash: The Bar/Bat Mitzvah ceremony will look different in each congregation, but typically the climax is the reading of the Torah and giving of the *drash* in a Shabbat morning service. Ideas for incorporating a Bar/Bat Mitzvah service are in the appendix.

Basic Hebrew Education: Learning to read Hebrew is a major part of a traditional preparation for Bar/Bat Mitzvah. This is to enable the young adult to read from the Torah scroll in service. Hebrew education is outside the scope of the *Crossroads* program, but we highly recommend congregations incorporate this if possible. Resources for this are listed in the appendix.

Intro to Jewish and Messianic History: Most Jewish communities encorporate some amount of learning about the history of Judaism and Jewish identity. As Messianic Judaism is both a product of Judaism and Christianity, we recommend studying the history of both faiths. Resources for this are listed in the appendix.

Timeline to Your Bar/Bat (V)itzvah

6-12 months prior (process typically begun around 12th birthday)

- Begin Bible reading (see p. x in the *Crossroads* book)
- Establish a mentor
- Begin learning Hebrew

4-6 months prior

- Begin the Crossroads lessons with your cohort
- Begin studying Jewish/Christian/Messianic history (there is one lesson about this in the program, but doing more will increase your understanding)
- Choose your ceremony date
- Send save-the-dates (if desired)
- Begin planning your Mitzvah Project (see p. vi)

3 months prior

- Stay on track with this program, including lessons, Scripture reading, and memorization
- Send invitations
- Public immersion

1-2 months prior

- Plan any surrounding events (Erev Shabbat dinner, after-service lunch, Havdalah reception, etc.)
- Meet with your congregational leader to discuss your parsha and drash (have filled out p. viii-ix in the *Crossroads* book)
- Complete Mitzvah Project (see p. vi-vii in the Crossroads book)

2-4 weeks prior

- Meet with your congregational leader to discuss the order of service and each person's role
- Wrap up any remaining lessons or homework
- Provide digital photo and/or slideshow of student
- Make any last plans for décor, food, guests, etc.

More details for all of these things are located throughout the Crossroads book. Some are also elaborated on in this Teacher's Guide. Parents and teachers are encouraged to read the Crossroads book prior to beginning the course.

To Parents & Teachers

The *Crossroads* program is designed especially for use in a congregational setting, but it can be adapted to be used at home by parents as well when needed.

Mentorship is an important part of *Crossroads*. If you are using this program at home, it is even more critical to set up at least one mentor for your child, so that he or she is getting feedback from other adults in his or her life.

For use in a congregation, we recommend setting up "cohort" groups - a group of young people who are close to the same age and going through the program together. If you have a large group, you could break the group up by girls and guys or by age. While the traditional age for this program is 12-13, it is common for youth who are a bit older to want to go through this process if they joined a Messianic congregation later in their childhood. We don't recommend it younger than 12.

Classes can be taught by a dedicated teacher or by the parents of the young people invoved. Any dedicated adult can teach through this program - the format is open-and-go, needing only a Bible to go along with it. We encourage teachers to share their own personal stories and make this as applicable as possible to the students you are teaching.

The *Crossroads* course is intended for both Jewish and Gentile youth. Most Messianic communities have both Jewish and Gentile families, and we encourage communities to tailor this program to best meet their needs.

This core 18-lesson discipleship course is meant to be one element (albeit, a critical one) of the Bar/Bat Mitzvah preparation year. As explained on page ii, outside of these 18 lessons, we strongly encourage congregations and families to encorporate a Mizvah Project, Hebrew education, Jewish and Christian history education, and more. All of these elements together will combine to form a meaningful and impactful year for your student.

All Scripture references are in the Tree of Life Version, which you can learn more about at tlvbiblesociety.org.

If you have a student without a TLV version Bible, they will likely be able to figure out the missing words from a different translation. The biggest goal is to become more familiar with their Bible - there is no "perfect" translation of Scripture.

(V)entrship

A powerful tool in developing young adults as leaders is mentorship. You as the parents are the ultimate mentor, but it is also valuable to have another adult outside your family to mentor your student as they transition into young adulthood. This person isn't there to take your place as the parents, but to give another trusted source of godly wisdom, encouragement, and insight.

Each B'nei Mitzvah student should, along with his or her parents, choose a mentor adult to walk alongside him or her through this journey. Our hope is that a deep relationship will develop that will be a source of life for the student for years to come, even long after this season of transition is over.

We suggest that you together choose someone who displays godly character and wisdom. The mentor should be the same gender as your child, as part of the goal is to display godly manhood/womanhood for your child to aspire to and work through issues that are genderspecific.

Here are some questions to consider when looking for a mentor:

- Do I look up to this person?
- Does it seem like I'll get along with this person?
- Is this person engaged in the local community?
- Does this person display a life of integrity?
- Does this person display a passion for the Lord?
- Is this person willing to commit to helping me grow spiritually and practically?

Each of the 18 lessons have a series of questions at the end of it for students to go through with their parents and mentor. Of course, the student can also ask for wisdom in any other area of life, but these guided questions are made to help the student progress through the program and through a directed course of discipleship.

We suggest that each family set up a weekly time for the student and mentor to meet together to go over these questions and build relationship.

Enjoy this journey and the relationships you build along the way!

(V)y (mmersion

Lesson 14 is all about immersion - what it is and why it is important for disciples of Yeshua. As part of your journey to becoming a Bar/Bat Mitzvah, we believe it is valuable to be immersed in water. This is an outward sign of your decision to be a disciple of Messiah and of the rebirth that occurs when we give our lives to Him.

If you are a part of a congregation or synagogue, they likely already have a system in place for how they do immersion. But if not, or if you are doing this as a family without a faith community, here are some ideas:

This is the traditional Jewish blessing for immersion:

ַבְּרוּך אַתָּה יְיָ אֶלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶך הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר קִדְשֶׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתִיו, וְצִוְנוּ עַל הַטְבִילָה

Baruch atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melech ha olam, asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav vitzivanu al ha tevilah. Blessed are You, O Lord our God, King of the universe, who has sanctified us with His

commandments and commands us concerning immersion.

Asking a few questions helps ensure that the person being immersed understands the weightiness of what he/she is doing. Here are some questions you can use:

Have you repented from sin and dead works, and renounced all evil?

Do you have confidence of God's salvation through the atonement of Yeshua the Messiah alone? Do you surrender yourself to Yeshua the Messiah and commit yourself to be his disciple, following after him and walking in his ways?

When the student affirms these questions, the following (or something like it) can be recited before the person goes underwater. In Christianity, it is common for the person to be dunked under and brought back up by someone; in Judaism the person undergoing immersion bends their knees and dunks themselves. Either way is acceptable and meaningful.

Because of your repentance from dead works, confession of faith in the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob through our Master, Yeshua the Messiah, and your commitment to follow him in discipleship, I now immerse you in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

In Messianic Judaism, we immerse in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (*Ruach haKodesh*) because this is what is directly instructed to us by Yeshua shortly before His ascension. (See Matthew 28:19)

We also see in Scripture the importance of laying hands people in prayer. Laying hands on the student who was immersed can be a powerful time for the family and/or community.

The *Shehecheyanu* is a traditional prayer that is recited at holidays and other special times in our lives and is appropriate for an immersion as well:

בְּרוּך אַתָּה יִיָ אֶלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶך הָעוֹלָם שֶׁהֶחֶיָנוּ וְקוְּמְנוּ וְהִגִּיעָנוּ לוְמַן הַזֶּה

Baruch atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melech ha olam, shehecheyanu, v'kiyimanu, v'higi'anu laz'man hazeh. Blessed are You, O Lord our God, King of the universe, who has kept us alive, sustained us, and enabled us to reach this season.

(V)y (V)itzvah Project

In most Jewish communities, part of the Bar/Bat Mitzvah year is the completion of a "Mitzvah Project."

As you may know, the concept of *Tikkun Olam - Reparing the World -* is a core value of Judaism and is held to as a major responsibility of the Jewish people. Jew or Gentile, our Father has given us a mandate **to care for this world that He has created and the people in it** - this is a integral part of what it means to be a follower of Messiah Yeshua.

And so, part of this program is the completion of some kind of major project that helps others and shines the light of Messiah to the greater community around your student(s).

On pages vi and vii of the *Crossroads* book, there is a worksheet for your students to fill out as they work on their Mitzvah Project. Students can do the project individually or together, but either way it should be a challenging endeavor for them.

If you are helping a student decide what to do for his/her Mitzvah Project, consider:

- What am I good at?
- What do I like doing?
- How much time do I have until my Bar/Bat Mitzvah?
- What kind of needs are there in my community?

Ideas might include fundraising for an important cause, making blankets or winter hats for cancer patients or homeless kids, volunteering in a nursing home, collecting donations for those in need, cooking meals for single mothers... The list could go on and on.

We recommend that you take time throughout the 18 week class to help walk your students through this process, help troubleshoot any difficulties, and celebrate with them as they complete it.

Preparing for Ny Nidrash

The climax of the Bar/Bat Mitzvah year is when the student is called to the Torah in front of the congregation, typically on a Shabbat.

This event looks different in each community, but often includes:

- Carrying the Torah scroll in the procession around the sanctuary
- Reading from the Torah scroll in Hebrew
- Reciting liturgical prayers
- Giving a midrash (a short teaching based on the weekly Torah portion)

Hebrew education is outside the scope of the *Crossroads* program. However, there are many excellent resources and curricula. We have a few listed in the glossary, and there are many more. If this is going to be part of your student's Bar/Bat Mitzvah, you will need to add that element to your classes.

But even if your congregation doesn't have a Torah scroll, or if your student isn't interested in learning Hebrew, or if you're a parent having an at-home Bar/Bat Mitzvah for your child, we still strongly recommend having your student give a *midrash* (also called a *drash* or *d'var Torah*) on the Torah portion for that Shabbat.

Having your student go through the process of studying the week's portion and forming a short lesson from it is a great way to apply what they're learning during their Bar/Bat Mitzvah year and share it with your community. It is also a stretch outside their comfort zone, which is important for this journey.

On pages viii and ix of the *Crossroads* book, there is a worksheet to walk your students through the process of writing their *drash*.

We recommend that you take time throughout the 18 week class to check in with your students to see how this process is going for them and help troubleshoot any difficulties.

The essons

The rest of the Teacher's Guide is comprised of each lesson, with the Scripture memory passage for each one and the fill-in answers for all of the Scriptures in each lesson.

- We strongly encourage you as the parent or teacher to elaborate on the lesson as you feel led, as you know your class personally and know what they might gain more benefit from. We also encourage you to share your own personal stories and make this as applicable as possible to the students you are teaching. Learning from the wisdom of others is a big part of what makes this program unique and impactful.
- » Each week your students will have an assigned Scripture memory passage. They need to work on memorizing this over the course of the week. You can decide if you want to have the parents responsible for listening to the memory work and signing it off before the next lesson or if you are going to do it in class.
- » These verses are given here in the Tree of Life Version, but as the teacher you can allow your students to use a different version if they prefer. Printable flashcards for practicing are available in the TLV and ESV versions at www.messianickids.com/crossroads.
- » The **In His Word** fill-ins are all from the TLV also. If your students don't have that version, they can fill in the best fit from whatever version they do have. Feel free to help them figure it out if need be. Most of the blanks will be fairly obvious regardless of what version of the Bible the student uses.
- » The **Talk About It** sections are a chance to get your students to discuss what they're learning. Getting them talking about it is another way to help process the information and will help them remember it better. Your class may be a bit shy in the beginning, but keep encouraging the conversation and they will eventually open up more!

Have fun and be blessed as you partake on this adventure together!



This first lesson is intentionally shorter than the rest. This is to give the class time to get to know each other and the Crossroads program.

Scripture Memory

"Therefore everyone who hears these words of Mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. ²⁵And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house; and yet it did not fall, for its foundation had been built on the rock."

Matthew 7:24-25

This course utilizes a few elements in the lessons in addition to the written text. These are: **Scripture Memory** (above, to be done at home), **In His Word** (places to look up Scripture and fill in the missing words), **Talk About It** (discussion questions), and **Walk With the Wise** (questions for parents and mentors).

While you as the teacher *could* read every lesson to your students, we recommend having them take turns reading the lesson aloud. This way they will be more invested in the lesson and more likely to remember it well.

As you progress through the lesson, we suggest that you add your own input and thoughts to what is written in the book. As you share from your heart, especially your own stories and journey, your students will learn from your wisdom and insight, and grow to trust you as a godly adult in their lives.

In His Word

You will see the word HaShem used in place of God in various places in this book. Both mean the same, but some of your students may be more familiar with one term over the other.

Acts 19:6 "And when Paul laid <u>HANDS</u> upon them, the <u>RUACH HA-KODESH</u> came <u>UPON</u> them, and they began speaking in tongues and <u>PROPHESYING</u>."

This was a packed lesson. As with all of the lessons, we encourage congregations to teach according to their beliefs. Throughout the Messianic movement there are varying beliefs on the role of the Holy Spirit in the lives of believers.

This book was written from the perspective that the gifts of the Holy Spirit are present and active today, and that the Ruach HaRodesh functioning in our lives today is the most "Messianic" thing there is. He is the One sent by our Messiah as the firstfruits and a down-payment on the Messianic Era.

However, if your community/family teaches differently, we encourage you to discuss this with your students. Helping them understand that there are different ideas about various topics in Scripture is a beneficial thing. And even more important, showing that we can have unity in the body along with our diversity is a beautiful and powerful witness to the power of God!

'But this is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel <u>AFTER</u> those days' — it is a declaration of ADONAI — 'I will put My <u>TORAH</u> within them. Yes, I will <u>WRITE</u> it on their <u>HEART</u>. I will be their <u>GOD</u> and they will be My <u>PEOPLE</u>. ³³No longer will each <u>TEACH</u> his neighbor or each his <u>BROTHER</u>, saying: '<u>KNOW</u> ADONAI,' for they will <u>ALL RNOW</u> Me, from the least of them to the <u>GREATEST</u>.' It is a declaration of ADONAI.

It is critical that your students understand salvation and have begun their relationships with the Lord. If this lesson moved too quickly for any of your students, or there are questions left unanswered, we strongly recommend you take some extra time to discuss these things.

Acts 16:30-31 says, "He said, 'What must I do to be saved?' They said, 'Put your trust in the Lord Yeshua and you will be saved." And Acts 4:12 says, "There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved!" These are strong words, and this is the most important step each of us must make.

The beautiful and wonderful thing is that we don't need to worry about earning our salvation - it is a free gift that we need only believe in and receive.

But please don't assume your students have already made this decision. It may be a good idea to also speak with the parents to ensure that this step has been made before progressing any further into the program.

This is the last lesson in unit one. The next set of lessons gets more into Messianic Judaism and some unique things that we consider foundational and important, such as the roles of Jews and Gentiles, and the history of how Messianic Judaism has developed.


In His Word



For You have created my conscience. You knit me together in my mother's womb. ¹⁴I praise You, for I am awesomely, wonderfully made! One of the suggested requirements for the *Crossroads* B'nei Mitvah Program is that each student undergoes immersion. As a public affirmation of one's faith, it is our belief that if a student is not ready for this step, they are not yet ready to become a Bar/Bat Mitzvah either. If you have students who have not yet been immersed, this is a great time to discuss taking this step and considering if they are ready to complete the B'nei Mitzvah program. More ideas for immersion are in the *Crossroads* introduction on p. x.

Alossary

This is a list of words from these lessons that your students may not be familiar with. Many of them come from a Hebrew or Greek word, and are transliterated in the lesson. Transliterated words are written in English letters in the way they are pronounced in their original language.

Apocrypha = a set of 14 books, not considered canonical, included in the Septuagint and the Vulgate as part of the Old Testament, but usually omitted from Protestant editions of the Bible.

Amidah (עַמִידָה) = the standing prayer - one of the oldest known and central prayers in Judaism, recited in the daily prayer times.

b'rit (הָרִית) = covenant.

challah (תַּלָּה) = a rich bread containing eggs, usually braided, typically made for Shabbat.

chametz (דָמָץ) = a food not allowed during Pesach, made with leaven or a leavening agent.

convocation = an assembly or gathering together.

diaspora = the body of Jewish people living outside the land of Israel.

Didiche ($\delta_{\iota}\delta\alpha\chi\dot{\eta}$) = a short book, believed to have written by the apostles or their own disciples during the first or second century CE, specifically to Gentiles.

drash = a shortened version of midrash.

d'uar Torah = another term used to refer to a midrash, often one of a short length.

erev Shabbat (שֶׁרֶב שַׁבָּת) = the evening beginning Shabbat.

Gentile = someone from any of the nations of the world who is not Jewish by blood. Not synonymous with pagan or unbeliever.

HaShem (הַשָּׁם) = literally, The Name - a common circumlocution used for God.

Havdalah (הַבְדָלָה) = the ceremony closing Shabbat after the sun goes down.

kiddush (קידוש) = the blessing to God given over wine at the beginning of a holy day.

kohen/kohanim (בֹּהֵן) = priest/priests (also spelled cohen/cohanim).

kedoshim (קִדשִׁים) = holy ones.

matzah/matzot (מַצָּה) = unleavened crackers, used especially during Pesach.

mazel tov (מַזֶל טוֹב) = congratulations.

midrash (מִדְרָשָׁ) = a exegetical teaching from the Torah, typically from the weekly Torah portion, usually given weekly in a synagoue.

mikuah/mikua'ot (מִקְוָה) = a pool used for immersion in Jewish settings.

mitzvah/mitzvot (מִצְוָה) = good deed or commandment.

mo'ed/mo'edim (מוֹעֵד) = appointed time(s) or holiday(s).

Mashiach (מָשָׁים) = Anointed One or Messiah (also spelled Moshiach).

Nazarenes = the first name given to the sect of Judaism that followed Yeshua. The name comes from the fact that Yeshua was from Nazareth.

omer (עָּמֶר) = literally, a sheaf - a dry measure of grain, but is used to refer to the counting that happens daily from Pesach to Shavuot.

Pesach (פָּסַח) = Passover.

Rosh Hashanah (רֹאשׁ הַשָּׁנָה) = literally, The Head of the Year, or New Year's Day.

Ruach HaKodesh (רוּחַ הָקוֹדֵשׁ) = the Holy Spirit.

Septuagint = the oldest Greek version of the Tanak, translated by 70 or 72 Jewish scholars in the third century BCE.

Shabbat (שַׁבָּת) = Sabbath, the seventh day of the week.

Shavuot (שָׁבוּעוֹת) = the Feast of Weeks.

Sh'ma (שָׁמַע) = also spelled Shema, the most foundational prayer in Judaism, recited three times a day in liturgical prayers, from Deuteronomy 6:4.

Shemini Atzeret (שָׁמִינִי עֲצֶרֶת) = the Eighth Day of Assembly, immediately following Sukkot.

shlichim (שָׁלִיחִים) = literally, sent ones, or Apostles.

siddur (סָדוּר) = a book of Jewish liturgical prayers.

sukkah (סוּכָה) = a temporary shelter set up for the holiday of Sukkot.

Sukkot (סָכּוֹת) = the Feast of Tabernacles.

tallit (טַלִית) = a Jewish prayer shawl.

Talmud (תַּלְמוּד) = the body of Jewish civil and ceremonial law and legend comprising the *Mishnah* and the *Gemara*. There are two versions of the Talmud: the Babylonian Talmud (which dates from the 5th century CE but includes earlier material) and the earlier Jerusalem Talmud.

Tanak (תְּנָ״ך) = an acronym referring to the Jewish Scriptures/Old Testament. The Tanak was compiled by Jewish scholars long before the days of Yeshua and consists of three parts – the Torah (תּוֹרָה), the Prophets (Nevi'im (נְבִיאִים), and the Writings (Ketuvi'im (תוֹבִים)). Also written as Tanack, Tanakh, and T'N'K.

Targum (תָרָגוּם) = a translation or paraphrase in Aramaic of a book or part of the Tanak.

tefillin (תָּבִּילִין) = phylacteries. A pair of small, black, leather cubes containing a piece of parchment inscribed with specific verses from the Torah and attached with straps to the left arm and the forehead during weekday morning prayers.

tithe = the tenth part of income set apart as an offering to God.

Torah (תּוֹרָה) = literally, teaching - the first five books of the Scriptures, given to Moses at Mount Sinai.

Trinity = a term created in early Christianity to refer to the plural unity or triune nature of God, eternally present as the Father, the Son (Yeshua) and the Holy Spirit, all functioning as one entity but with distinct roles.

tzedakah (צדקה) = literally means "justice" or "righteousness", but usually used to refer to charitable giving.

tzitzit (צִיצִית) = the fringes formerly worn at the corners of the outer garment and now worn at the four corners of the tallit.

Yom Teruah (יוֹם הַרוּעָה) = the Day of Blowing, the original name given by God to Rosh Hashanah.

Yom Kippur (יוֹם כִּיפּוּר) = the Day of Atonement.

*Please Note: Effort has been made to review the resources listed here, but we encourage all parents and teachers to review any materials given to students. Time to Celebrate!

A Bar or Bat Mitzvah is a big deal! There is a lot of time and energy invested in the preparation for this special event in a young adult's life. And as such, it should be celebrated!

We encourage each family and/or congregation to craft a celebration that works best for them. In a modern Jewish community, a Bar/Bat Mitzvah celebration is often a huge expense for the family and can even be similar to a wedding in its grandeur. And though we encourage you to mark this occasion with some kind of celebration, there's no particular expectation for what that *should* look like.

Some ideas for how you could celebrate your Bar/Bat Mitzvah include:

- Sending printed invitations for the event.
- Erev Shabbat dinner hosted at your home for family and close friends. Bar Mitzvah boys lead the blessings for the first time, and Bat Mitzvah girls light the Shabbat candles.
- Luncheon after your congregation's Shabbat service. This could be potluck or catered, fancy or simple.
- Havdalah Party at your home or other suitable location. Kick back, celebrate, toast the new young adult, share fun stories, play music and dance, etc...
- An at-home ceremony, if you don't have a congregation, with family and friends gathered together. You can incorporate many of the elements that would be present in a congregation's ceremony.
- A bar/bat mitzvah certificate signed by the student's parents and/or leaders in your congregation.

Remember, though, that this is just an example! You are free to customize this as you feel best fits your community, family, and child.

A Sample Ceremony

If you attend an established Messianic congregation, the Bar/Bat Mitzvah ceremony that happens within the service is probably already set for you. But if you are a younger Messianic congregation, or a family without a congregation, here are some ideas on how you can craft a Bar/Bat Mitzvah ceremony:

- Student helps lead liturgical blessings during the service or gathering.
- Student reads the Torah portion in Hebrew. This is traditionally done from a Torah scroll but could also be read from a Hebrew *Chumash/Tanak*. If Hebrew education isn't part of your B'nei Mitzvah year or your congregation's Torah service, this could be read in English.
- Student gives the *Midrash*. This is a short teaching based on the Torah portion for the week. An outline for preparing this is provided in the introduction.
- Student shares his or her testimony of salvation.
- Student's parents share about their son or daughter.
- Congregation or family/friends gather around the student, lay hands on, and pray for the student as he or she enters this next phase of life.
- A short slideshow of the student's life is shown.

If you a Messianic Gentile family, you may be wondering how to approach the B'nei Mitzvah process with your child. There are different thoughts on this topic, and we have talked to different people, Jew and Gentile, about how they navigate this.

Some choose to use a different term with a Gentile student, such as "Bar/Bat Avraham" or "Bar/Bat B'rit" in order to maintain distinction between Jew and Gentile in their community.

Others believe that it is acceptable to use the term "Bar/Bat Mitzvah" for a Gentile student, as they are also choosing to submit themselves to the authority of God's word, even if that relationship does look a bit different to them than it would if they were Jewish.

The most important thing either way is that the process is taken seriously either way, and that a Gentile isn't "pretending" to be Jewish, but rather taking a serious step in their faith journey that is reflected in their decision to become a Bar/Bat Mitzvah.
